REFLECTION

Ministry - Cause of Great Joy!

Following his interchange with John's disciples, Jesus made one of the most definitive and audacious statements of his entire ministry. Praising John, he called him, "more than a prophet," saying he was greater than anyone born of woman. At the same time, making a clear distinction between the past and present, Jesus went on to say "the least in the Kingdom of heaven is greater than he." This was not a put down of John but the announcement that something new was happening.

Jesus represented God's definitive intervention in human history. The time of prophecy, the time of waiting has come to an end. From Moses through John, the prophets had talked about God. In Jesus, God had come to dwell among the people. With the culmination of Jesus' life in his death and resurrection, God would be as fully revealed as will ever happen in human history. The least of those who recognize that truth have received a greater revelation than John.

We will find a cause for great joy when we continue the ministry and compassion of Jesus.

Jesse Tree in Church

Each year the Jesse Tree appears in Church during the season of Advent. Some wonder what it is all about. The symbols placed on the tree are used to show the lineage of Jesus.

Jesse was the father of the great King David of the Old Testament, so Jesse is often looked upon as the first in the genealogy of Jesus. Ornaments placed on the tree are based on the Bible.

This week reflect on these scripture passages daily.

Dec. 11 Jesse: 1 Sam. 16:1-13

Symbols: crimson robe, shepherd's staff

Dec. 12 *David:* 1 Sam. 17:12-51 *Symbols:* slingshot, 6-pointed star Dec. 13 *Solomon:* 1 Kings 3:5-14, 16-28

Symbols: scales of justice, temple, two babies and sword

Dec. 14 Joseph: Matt. 1:18-25

Symbols: hammer, saw, chisel, angle Dec. 15 Mary: Matt. 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-38 Symbols: lily, crown of stars, pierced heart

Dec. 16 *John the Baptist:* Mark 1:1-8 *Symbols:* shell with water, river

Dec. 17 Jesus is Wisdom: Sirach 24:2; Wisdom 8:1

Symbols: oil lamp, open book

Gaudete Sunday



This Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent is also called *Gaudete Sunday* after the Latin word *gaudere*, to rejoice. Rejoicing is the theme of the day. Today's Entrance Antiphon says: *Rejoice in the*

Lord always; again I say, Rejoice. Indeed the Lord is near. — Philippians 4:4-5

It reminds us of the tone of joy that permeates the entire Season of Advent. The basis of our joy is this: "THE LORD IS NEAR". The use of rose vestments and the rose candle on the Advent Wreath underlies this day's special character. It expresses our joy at the Lord's coming.
